What will change?

Oceanside's current At-Large electoral system will transition to a By-District system. Council members will be required to live in the district where they seek election and will be elected by the residents of that district. The Mayor will continue to be elected by the entire City (At-Large).

Who determines the boundaries of the City Council Districts?

Your insight on your community will help establish proposed district boundaries. The City will hold four public hearings before the City Council and five community meetings over the next 90 days. The City Council will ultimately make the final decision.

Why should I attend a meeting?

It's your opportunity to be involved and participate, help define your community and be heard. A demographer will explain the process for shaping Oceanside's districts. Meetings will be held throughout the city to guarantee everyone interested has the opportunity to take part. All community meetings will include a Spanish interpreter.
